Scientific breakthrough in the protection against all coronavirus variants – a decisive step towards ending the coronavirus pandemic

San Jose, California, USA / Heerlen, Netherlands. Humankind has made a decisive further step towards the goal of ending the coronavirus pandemic for good. By combining specific micronutrients, i.e., biologically active natural substances, it is possible to simultaneously inhibit all infection pathways used by coronaviruses to infect the human body. This scientific breakthrough is thus the first universal mechanism to protect against all known coronavirus variants and mutations. Since all coronaviruses – including previously unknown mutations – use the same infection pathways, this is the first scientifically justified way to prevent future coronavirus pandemics effectively.

This research approach was developed at the Dr. Rath Research Institute in San Jose, California. Over the past three years, the scientific results of this institute have been continuously forwarded for evaluation, to the US Patent and Trademark Office, the US government agency responsible for new scientific and technical developments. In the autumn of 2022, this comprehensive research was awarded a US patent, number 11419847B2, bearing the title: 'Pharmaceutical micronutrient composition and its use to simultaneously inhibit multiple cellular mechanisms of infectivity caused by coronavirus, its variants, and mutants.'

In December 2022, the legal approval of this scientific breakthrough by the Patent Office was made known to a broad public. On December 12, 2022, the announcement appeared in *The Washington Times*, followed, on December 16, 2022, by the international edition of *The Wall Street Journal*, an influential information source for political and economic decision-makers worldwide. In both instances, the publication of this breakthrough was preceded by an extensive legal review. In particular, the publication by *The Wall Street Journal* was a clear indication that broad sections of the global economy are no longer willing to see their future threatened by ever- more restrictions.

Just two days after the first publication, the Director-General of the World Health Organization (WHO) announced that discussions would begin imminently, on the criteria for announcing the end of the worldwide pandemic declared by the WHO. Shortly afterwards, the German government declared that it would end funding for vaccination centers in Germany from January 1, 2023. These decisions are no coincidence. They show that 'business as usual' is no longer an option in the fight against the coronavirus pandemic.
